



A Brief Background

Marla's story is one of heartache, abuse, resilience, and empowerment. After losing both her parents before the age of 10, she was abused until adulthood. By the age of 18, she was homeless with nothing and no one to turn to, from living in shelters to jail cells. She overcame homelessness and began to prosper. All while remembering those who are still suffering. She has used her experience to spread the message of love, hope, and perseverance to homeless communities everywhere.

As co-founders of the Bautista Project Inc, she and her partner formulated a strategy to end homelessness, one individual at a time.

Their five-phase strategy focuses on educating, empowering, and reintegrating homeless individuals into communities with sociability and long-term program support.

Our Homeless Community

Hillsborough County, FL has a population of more than **1.4 million people**. Of that, more than **1500 people** are considered homeless.

TBP INC LIVES TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

The Bautista Project Inc Lives Transitional housing program provides people private housing (via individual rooms and tiny homes), permanent supportive housing, and emergency shelter (limited bed space)*. Our housing initiative allows homeless community members time to recover from trauma and restart their lives. The idea behind transitional housing is that it provides previously homeless people with resources that orient them away from homelessness. This includes training through the You Belong program, long-term case management, counseling, and guidance in obtaining affordable housing.

*A transitional housing agreement is required to be signed before acceptance into the program.

Why Housing?

Because It's Their Right

Personal Safety is a fundamental human right, even when you're homeless. Without a stable and safe place to live, most individuals cannot thrive. Physiological needs must be satisfied in order to be successful at school, work, and in life in general. Providing a safe, secure place for homeless individuals to live relieves stress, prevents injury and illness, and offers an opportunity for growth.

The brain cannot learn when it is stressed nor can the brain focus on learning when basic needs are not being met. This is where it is important to understand Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs. Our organization believes that financial resources are wasted if basic living essentials are not fulfilled.



Facility Needs

The nature of the Bautista Project Headquarters facility is to provide a safe place for homeless community members to learn, grow, and have their basic needs met. The required space will be a multi-use lot with a fenced-in parking area for employees and a separate fenced-in outdoor green space for activities like gardening, playing, and more.

To be successful, the Bautista Project Inc team needs a lot that is functional and spacious. Because homeless individuals have unique needs and a hard time meeting them. Our facility will encompass a computer lab, kitchen, cafeteria, personal mailboxes, consultation rooms, a large classroom, laundry room, locker room, Sleeping rooms, and individual tiny homes, and separate entrance and office space for employees.

Community Center












- Background checks on every person who enters the shelter
- Look up DOC and SO info (Department of Corrections, Sex Offender)
- 24/7 Security Guard on-site

Shelter Rules

Expectations set the tone for the transitional housing and headquarters building. People want to feel safe and secure. At the Bautista Project Inc, we make that happen by implementing rules.

- Respect the rights, peace, and property of everyone
- Work on a housing and academic plan to the best of your ability
- No sex, drugs, weapons, gambling on The Bautista Project Inc grounds

Long-Term Support

Long-term support services are as unique as the individuals needing them. The Bautista Project Inc will provide long-term support services for clients for up to 24 months. This time frame is crucially imperative to our client's success, as many homeless individuals re-enter homelessness between 17 and 24 months if left unsupported. Support will be given based on an individual's needs and will be tapered until the 24-month mark. If needed, the individuals can always attend support groups or new classes after completing the program.
